At last residents of Poynton have a good use for their Council Tax Bill, they can use it to gain a free visit to the museum on Saturday 14th May. See the many changes that have happened over the last few years, including the giant diorama of Poynton as it looked c1900.

Geoff Challinor, Chairman said "I am often told by local people that they have visited the museum but several years ago. Every year the museum changes and I thought it would be a great opportunity to show the enhancements to people who may not have been for a few years."

The museum has won several awards of the years and is repeatedly told from visitors "we had no idea you were so big or had so much to offer." To help ensure all Poynton residents know just what we have to offer, we are offering free admission (for up to four people per household) on Saturday 14th May when they show at the door their 2011 Council Tax bill with an SK12 post code. Remember - children under 12 also receive free admission.

As well as the impressive collection of Internal Combustion engines and steam engines we regularly have demonstrations of ancient crafts – bodging and blacksmith work – and of course the giant model of Poynton c1900 showing the collieries of the area with local historian Roy Dudley available to answer residents questions.

Additionally, as the 14th May is also International Night of Museums (when museums across the world are asked to open late) we will not close at 5pm as normal but stay open until 8pm so you can enjoy engines at twilight.

Engines at Twilight Open until 20:00 Saturday 14th May

The museum will once again be taking part in this International movemement by opening late. Many engines running with talks on how they work and engine development through the years. The scale model of Poynton c1900 showing all the collieries of the time will also be available to view.
