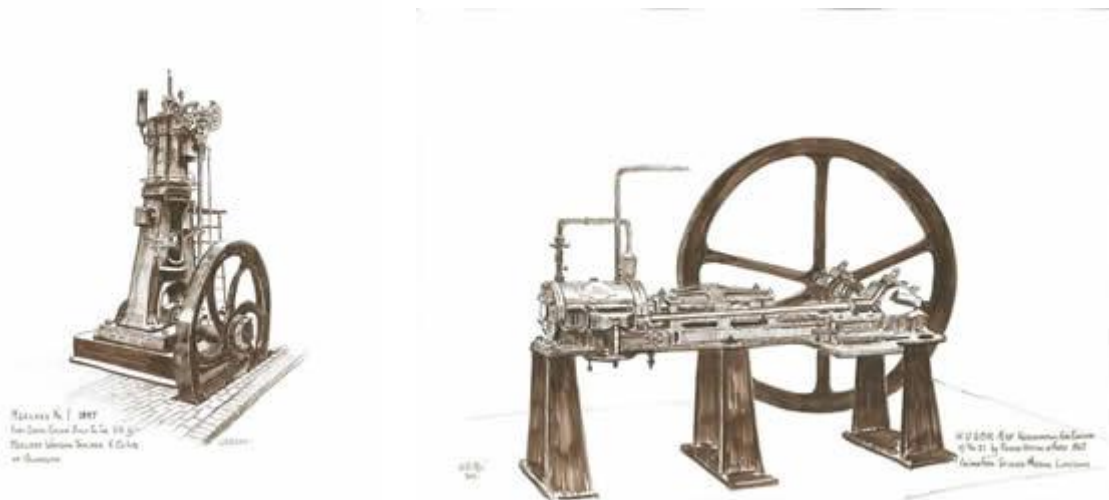

Queen's Award for Voluntary Services

June 2013

We are delighted to announce that our loyal team of volunteers has received The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service for their ongoing dedication and commitment. This is the highest award (the equivalent of an MBE) given to volunteer groups across the UK for outstanding work in their local communities. This coveted award, inaugurated in 2002 to celebrate Her Majesty The Queen's Golden Jubilee year, is made annually to groups who have completed 'outstanding voluntary work in the community' and sets the national benchmark for excellence in volunteering, with the work of those awarded being judged to be of the highest standard.

The museum has received the Award for the "development of a unique and specialist engineering museum as an award-winning visitor attraction". It acknowledges the work carried out by the volunteers in an impressive range of roles.

The museum volunteers will receive a certificate signed by the Queen together with a commemorative crystal. These will be presented at a special ceremony by the The Lord-Lieutenant of Cheshire David Briggs, MBE, KStJ.

In June four representatives from the Anson Engine Museum will attend a Royal Garden Party at Buckingham Palace.

Our volunteers are "Team of the Year"

A glamorous award ceremony celebrated Cheshire and Warrington's top-performing tourism businesses.

The Marketing Cheshire Annual Awards in Association with M&S Bank recognised the outstanding work delivered by all sectors of the tourism and hospitality industry and the professionals who work in it.

More than 370 guests attended the prestigious awards at the M&S Bank European Headquarters on Friday, November 23, and enjoyed champagne and canapés before sitting down to an evening hosted by actress and presenter Terri Dwyer.

"My only hesitation about nominating them for team of the Year was they should be given this title each and every year. Perhaps they will settle for Team of the Year 2012 in recognition of all that they do. I am so proud that they have been recognized in this way."

The judges agreed that the volunteers demonstrate the best teamwork in the area.
